e-Visa

An e-Visa is an official document permitting entry into and travel from Egypt.

The visa fee is collected through the website using a credit card, after registering the foreigner's data.

The single-entry visa price is 25\$.

The e-visa is eligible for 30 days from the day of entry.

E-visas can be obtained through https://visa2egypt.gov.eg/

The e-visa requires 7 working days or less to be issued and valid for 90 days.

Entry requirements (on arrival)

- Passport valid for at least 6 months from arrival date.

- E-Visa printout
- Travel itinerary
- Hotel bookings/details about places to visit if going as tourist.

Visa on Arrival

Visitors must hold a passport from an eligible country and meet the entry conditions to be granted a visa on arrival in Egypt.

Travelers eligible for the Egypt visa on arrival include: EU nationals and passport holders from

- Canada
- Japan
- New Zealand
- the United States
- Macedonia
- Serbia
- Macao
- United Arab Emirate

- Kingdom of Saudi Arabia
- Kuwait
- Bahrain
- Georgia
- Malaysia
- South Korea
- Australia
- Oman

The visa on arrival costs 25\$ to be paid by cash only. Card payment is not accepted. You should aim to have the exact amount. You can stay in the country for up to 30 days with an Egyptian visa on arrival.



Pre-entry Visa at The Consulate

Anyone who is not exempt from Egypt visa requirements and who is not eligible to receive an Egypt Visa on Arrival or online has to apply through an Egyptian embassy or consulate in their country or a neighboring country.

Egypt visa application process is as follows:

- 1. Contact the Egyptian embassy or consulate to set up an appointment.
- 2. Complete the Egypt Visa Application Form. You can get the application form at the embassy/consulate offices.
- 3. Gather the required documents.
- 4. Pay the Egypt visa fee- price varies from 15\$ to 40\$.
- 5. Submit the documents and application at the Egyptian embassy/ consulate. Check with them regarding the submission process, since some offices require you to submit the documents in person, whereas others also allow submissions through the mail.
- 6. Wait for the visa to be processed
- 7. Pick up your passport (or have it mailed back to you) with the visa affixed, if the application is approved.

The consulate/embassy may also require an interview if they see fit.

Pre-entry Visa at The Consulate

Egypt Visa Requirements:

When you apply for an Egypt visa, you need several documents to support your application, such as:

- The Egypt Visa application form (two copies)
- Two passport-size pictures of yourself (2inch x 2inch, white background, taken recently)
- Your passport, valid for at least six more months from the date of entry in Egypt and with at least two blank pages
- Two photocopies of the personal information page of your passport
- If you are not a citizen of the country from which you're applying: Your residence permit or other proof of legal residence
- Proof of a return or onward travel ticket
- Proof of accommodation in Egypt
- If you're traveling for business: A Letter of Invitation from the company which is hosting you
- Proof of payment of the visa fee
- If you apply by mail, also include a self-addressed and prepaid envelope so that the Egyptian embassy/consulate can return your passport and documents

If you're applying through an embassy or consulate, the processing time changes depending on the specific office. In most cases, it takes at least 10 working days, so make sure to apply well before you intend to travel, but no earlier than three months.

Exempted from Visa

- Afghanistan only if you are 50 years of age and over or 16 years of age and under.
- Algeria only if you are under 14 years of age.
- China only if you have a return or onward flight ticker as well as a reservation in a 4 or 5-star hotel and USD 2000 (or the equivalent in another currency).
- Libya only if you are a woman or a resident of the Butnan District on Sundays and Mondays.
- Jordan if you have an ordinary 5-year passport which is not stamped by the Jordanian Registration Office on the back cover.
- Lebanon only if you are 50 years of age and over or 16 years of age.
- Morocco only if you are 14 years of age and under.
- Sudan only if you are 50 years of age and over or 16 years of age and under or you are a female national.
- South Sudan only if you are 50 years of age and over or 16 years of age and under or you are a female national.
- Tunisia only if you are 14 years of age and under.
- Yemen only if you are 50 years of age and over or 16 years of age and under or you are traveling for medical purposes.
- Palestine you have a travel document issued by Egypt, Lebanon, Jordan, or Syria and you are over 40 years of age or under 18 years of age.

Exempted from Visa

- You are the child of an Egyptian father (unless you are from Syria, Iraq, Yemen, or Qatar)
- You are the child of an Egyptian mother born after 25 July 2004 (unless you are from Syria, Iraq, Yemen, or Qatar)
- You are a woman married to an Egyptian man (unless you are from Syria, Iraq, Yemen, or Qatar)
- Turkey passport holders can get an Egypt Visa on Arrival if they are 45 years of age and above or 18 years of age and below.
- Sudan passport holder can get an Egypt Visa on Arrival if they have a residence permit issued by Australia, Canada, USA, or an EU Member State.
- Resident Permit holders issued by a GCC Member State can get an Egypt Visa on Arrival if they have at least six more months left on the residence permit.
